Wolfson Files for Open City Council Seat

*First time candidate emphasizes quality of life,
citizens come first.*

Steve Wolfson filed today for the special election to fill the open Las Vegas City Council seat in Ward 2.

Wolfson, a local attorney, outlined the theme of his campaign as putting citizens and quality of life first. "When I moved here twenty-four years ago, I never had to worry about air quality, water supply, traffic or crime and safety," Wolfson said. "Now I do, and the people I talk with are worried too."

"I want to make every decision as a city councilman by first asking, what does this do to existing neighborhoods, what does it do to traffic, air, water and our quality of life. Have we involved neighbors in the process, and are we putting citizens first," Wolfson said.

Wolfson pledged to run an active race for the June 22nd special election. "My first mailer will be in homes tomorrow, I'm scheduling my time to go door to door, and I'll have signs ready to place within three days," Wolfson said. "I'm going to do everything I can to meet with as many citizens as possible in this very short time."

Wolfson, 50, is married and has two daughters. He served as a Clark County and federal prosecutor for seven years before entering private practice. Wolfson served as judge pro tempore in Clark County, Las Vegas and North Las Vegas. He presently serves on the Board of Governors of the State Bar of Nevada and on the Judicial Ethics and Campaign Election Practices Committee.
